Cynthia Chin-Lee

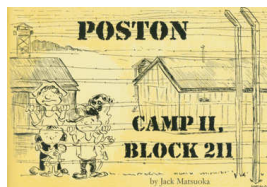

Margo King Lenson

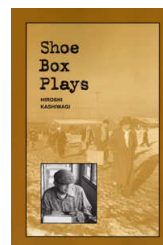

Hiroshi Kashiwagi

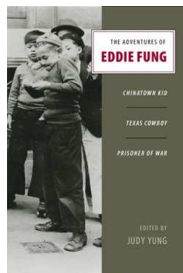

Rick Rocamora

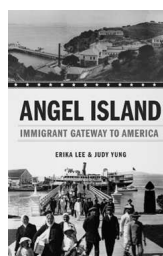
Documentary photographer and author of *America's Second-Class Veterans* will speak on the subject of his book, Filipino World War II veterans and their struggle for recognition and equity.
